Parks & Rec and Community Updates (Amy)

- Amy recently joined Denver's Star Community Advisory Committee. The STAR Program deploys Emergency Response Teams that include Emergency Medical Technicians and Behavioral Health Clinicians to engage individuals experiencing crises related to mental health issues, poverty, homelessness, and substance abuse. - Amy attended a meeting with the development company <u>BlueLine</u> who are working on a project for residences on Acoma near Urban Peak, just south of lowa. This project is meant to serve impacted community members – those of low income, mental health issues, transitioning, homelessness, designed to support and re-integrate. This meeting included many surrounding neighborhoods where there was a lot of push back. With all the recent challenges with homeless encampments in our area, this project may help alleviate this problem by providing more affordable housing in a mixed housing unit. Since the project falls within Overland Park neigborhood boundaries, we would like to reach out to them to provide more details of the project in one of our upcoming meetings.

Denver Water presentation on the Lead Reduction Program

Jose Salas and Rachele DiFebbo gave a presentation on the continuing Lead Reduction Program, now in it's second year.

Fun fact - Denver Water has been operating over 100 years and is the oldest and largest utiliy in Colorado serving 1.2 million people where our water supply comes directly from mountain snowpack in the Rocky Mountains that feeds the South Platte and Colorado Rivers.

Now in year 2, the Lead Reduction Program is focusing on replacing lead service lines, the plumbing which connects the home to the Denver water. There is no lead in the water that is delivered to homes but it can get mixed when it travels thru service lines. There are different components to the program. One being Corrosion Control where Denver water has increased the pH, the protective coating to protect all customers which allows the water to travel and not mix. Thru the Filter program they are delivering 100,000 free filter to anyone who needs it with free replacement cartridges provided every 6 months until after the lines have been replaced. The project is to last up to 15 years where lead pipes will be replaced at no direct cost to the customer.

If you get mail regarding this program, read it, fill it out and send it back. They are working by neighborhood and when in this area, you will be notified.

Question: Overland has experienced quite a large amount of growth. Have there been studies on how all the new construction has any impact on those lead lines. Some have noticed a reduction in flow after sharing the lines on the block. Answer – they have increased the pH to protect everyone by strengthening the coating in the lines. With any construction there would be flushing of the line which could impact flow. Here is a <u>link</u> which explains that process.

Community announcements (open to anyone)

o Bridge painting – Evans Bridge – Mara contacted Broadway Merchants
Association who helped us the first time to spray wash the sidewalks and jersey barriors along the bridge before we painted the mural. We need to do that again if we want to paint again to work on covering the graffiti that has been accummulating on top of the mural. They are willing to do this where the cost is around \$1,000. We just need to decide when to do this which should be scheduled right before we move forward to re-paint. We will need to put together a fall art committee meeting to figure out the timeline. Let us know if you are interested in being part of the art committee.

o Rebecca – Asked whether we would be interested in learning more about safe sanctioned homeless camps thru the <u>Colorado Village Collaborative</u>. This is an organization that provides clean, will maintained campsites for homeless where they also provide resources on site. This would be a temporary site, either a

Church parking lot or unused lot. Paul suggested the empty lot by Overland Pond. There could be other potential sites in the area. Mara has seen the one in Park Hill where it is appears to be very clean. We will look at having further discussions regarding this in a future meeting.
