Platte River Float Trip Update

Ronnie Crawford, River Rat Extraordinaire, has been monitoring the water flow on the river (CFS) to determine when is the right time to go floating, where there is enough water to have fun but not too much to be dangerous. This is NOT a neighborhood sponsored event, and is open to anyone to join at their own risk. The plan is to start the float from Carson's Nature Center, stop for lunch along the way at the Belleview Promenade, finishing the float at Sheridan River Park. Vape'n'Play (Megan and Taylor)

Megan and Taylor are the owners of the 2nd licensed cannabis consumption location, Vape and Play at 1753 S. Broadway. For the past 2 months they have been in a joint venture with the event planning company Dean Ween's Honey Pot Lounge where they learned a lot more about their business and the people they attract. In the past months of operation, they have not received any odor complaints or any other bad reports from other businesses or neighbors in the area. Working as a community based business model, Vape and Play initially came to us for a letter of support which included the hours of operation. Currently they are open from Noon-10:30pm Sunday-Wednesday and Noon-11:30pm Thursday-Saturday. Based on what they learned so far, they came back to us with the following 3 requests for our consideration and approval.

- 1. Hours of operation Request is to extend the hours of operation to Noon-Midnight 7 days a week with the option to extend to a 2am closure to allow for special events.
- 2. Spa events they would like to provide spa events in the facility where topical THC is used in therapeutic massage. This would be a new opportunity for them which is already approved by the department of public health.
- 3. Edibles they would like to add to their business model, the education of the usage of edibles where they would work directly with customers to teach them how edibles work and how it can affect them when using.

Mara made a motion to the group to support the addition of these 3 requests to the existing business model. It was seconded by Amy and put to a vote where it was passed unanimously.

Levitt Pavilion (Andy)

Andy Thomas is one of the (4 person) full time staff at Levitt Pavilion at Ruby Hill. Opening on Friday, May 24th, the non-profit concert venue is offering 53 free concerts along with some paid concerts throughout the summer. Levitt Pavilion also has a Community Advisory Board made up of people from the surrounding neighborhoods. Judy Greek is our neighborhood representative who you can talk to about any concerns you might have regarding the concerts including parking and traffic.

Levitt Pavilion is looking for volunteers to help out during their free concerts along with a number of interns they have recruited from CU Denver. Volunteering is a great way to get to know the facility and to enjoy this wonderful space while listening to some

great music. Duties include greeting concert goers, checking in VIPs and selling tshirts. See

Broadway Development (Ben Hrouda)

Flywheel Capital is a local development company, active in our neighborhood where in February they purchased 31,000 square feet of space on the north west corner of South Broadway and West Yale Avenue. They want this project to bring new life to the area. They presented a conceptual rendering of a 5 story building with the bottom floor as retail, second floor business space and 3 stories of rental units. Currently this area is zoned for 3 stories and they are asking for our support of a rezoning change to 5 stories (MS5). Housing would include 88 units which would include 1-2 bedroom and studio apartments, with 10% affordable units. They plan for 94 parking spaces for residents along with some surface parking for retail. Outreach to neighboring Swallow Hill has had a favorable response. They are also committed to seeding a fund for The Greenway Foundation which could benefit residents in the area. They are continuing to do further outreach to the neighbors in the immediate area and also looking for input as to what type of retail makes sense in this location. General consensus from the group was the need for fresh food, grocery/market which would enable local residents better access to necessities within walking distance, improving the overall walkability in this area.

A motion was made by Andrew, to agree to write a letter of support in favor of the project which would include further outreach to the immediate neighborhood area and a good neighbor agreement.

Motion was seconded by Mara. Motion passed with 14-For, 1-Against, 0-Abstained
