Community Planning and Development site

Anyone planning on rezoning should do a public outreach to let other neighbors know what is happening. During the re-zoning process the planning board looks at specific criteria including health and safety. During the process the public can add comments

thru letters to the case manager or to the planner. You don't have to live in the neighborhood to write a letter. Things that can be considered for future development include a neighborhood design with design idea book to be presented to anyone wanting to make changes or for re-zoning. Also, letting the city know what we want in the neighborhood can be done thru Historic Denver which has funds for this where neighborhoods can create a toolkit for new developers.

The key issue is knowledge and being aware of any re-zoning issues currently happening which would affect our neighborhood. There was some open discussion as to what is the best way to communicate rezoning issues out to everyone. Maggie provided some insight into how other RNOs are handling this including Baker and West Wash Park where they have formed a separate zoning committee that meets outside of the regular meeting to review and bring any important information back to the main meetings for further discussion or action plans. This is something we would like to find out more about and will be setting up a meeting between Maggie and other RNO contacts to learn more on how best to implement this into our own process of communication.

Green roof changes – City Council passed a <u>green buildings ordinance</u> to replace the green roofs initiative approved by voters in November 2017. The new law was carefully designed to honor the will of the voters who called for more sustainable development in Denver, while fixing the legal and practical challenges of the original ordinance.

Solid waste funding – working on how and where to build transfer station and working on continued education to get more people into the system of recycling and composting.

the Mayor's office, police dept and related agencies have been working together on issues surrounding Urban Peak where some bad people have been targeting kids in that area. Urban peak does not want them there. The agencies are working to remove the bad people so that the kids that are being serviced thru Urban Peak can focus on learning healthy life skills.
