DPD - OfficerKate Young and Officer AJ Pacheco

- Officer Pacheco gave a brief overview of crime stats for the community.
- DPD has a new program to help with vehicle theft <u>DenverTrack</u> The DenverTrack program works with the vehicles' GPS systems to track stolen vehicles in real time. The program requires vehicle owners to preauthorize Denver Police access to the manufacturer's GPS service (e.g., OnStar, etc.) in the unfortunate event that their vehicle is stolen. If the vehicle is stolen, when the vehicle owner calls police to report the theft, DPD can then track the vehicle in real time with the goal of locating and returning the vehicle to the owner and arresting the suspect.
 - Works with most vehicle GPS systems. For older vehicles a 3rd party GPS tracker may be required. Check out info on DPD website.

- Concerns of parking as neighborhood density increases. Project expects to have 75 parking spaces if they have 100 units, taking advantage of adjacent transit.. Parking with an off-alley garage. Retail will have an available parking garage as well. Neighbors encouraged careful traffic study is warranted as the intersection at Bannock and Evans continues to see increased use and lots of accidents.
- April 13th the project will go before the planning board for requested rezoning.
- Members voted to write a letter of support for rezoning with good neighbor agreement in place.

Proposed By-Law Language Changes

- Proposed language as follows:
 - In order to be eligible to vote at a meeting, a member shall have paid in full all membership dues at least 30 days prior to the date of that meeting. For any votes required during the January meeting, members who paid dues during the previous calendar year will be considered eligible to vote.
 - The Board shall have the power to authorize expenditures up to \$250.00 per month for a single purpose on its own. Notification of a proposed expenditure of more than \$250.00 for a single purpose shall be given to the general membership via email communication prior to the monthly meeting. At the next monthly meeting, the expenditure may be authorized by a majority vote of the general membership present either in-person or via online attendance. An emergency expenditure of more than \$250.00 for a single purpose may be made by the Board and reported to the general membership at the next monthly meeting, however, the Board must be prepared to offer justification for the emergency nature of the expense. The Board may exercise the emergency expenditure option no more than 3 times per calendar year.
