

# Overland Park Neighborhood Association (OPNA) – May 26th, 2022 MEETING MINUTES

- Crime Stats

Denver Animal Protection - division of DDPHE - Julian shared about events, resources, and services including free and low cost services available to dogs and cats. Today is a plea for community to activate.

- DAP Shelter right off South Platte. Encourage all to stop by to check out, adopt animal or volunteer
- Animal well fare is in crisis. Covid has really impacted their shelter.
  - Currently offering \$5 for adoption. Shelter is full and filling up frequently.
    - Owners are surrendering pets in insane numbers lots of pets during covid were acquired and for various reasons are being surrendered to shelters and they are coming in unsocialized, untrained and are difficult to adopt.
  - Encourage pet owners to take your pet through training. Encourage you
    to get your dog socialized take them to your friends/neighbors with
    dogs, or get them engaged with kids you know. Its so important for dogs
    to be socialized.
- DAP needs help with fosters please reach out if you are interested in fostering.
   Fostering is huge and can really help the stress on the system DAP got some

state variance to help expedite fostering process during this high need time.

- DAP is adjusting their website, and will soon have a web space for fostering, until then please reach out to <a href="mailto:anais.salcido@denvergov.org">anais.salcido@denvergov.org</a> -Foster Coordinator.
- DAP offers low cost pet vaccine clinics on weekends. \$15/vaccine distemper/parvo, rabies, etc. If you are struggling with medical costs they can
  help on some medical issues as well.

- DAP has officers that can help in complaints/concerns best to communicate
  first. Often your neighbor may not know their dog is barking when they are away.
  Most issues can be resolved through communication. If you need to you can
  report an issue anonymously but often at some point the case managers will
  need to disclose the concerned party. DAP is here to help you, please reach out.

- Climate Department
  - 1st round of incentives are out Incentives for replacing electric appliances, like Hot Water heater, or AC etc.
  - E-bike incentives had to pause was so popular but will be reopening again.
  - Vendors get reimbursed through city so you don't have to front the cash and wait for reimbursement.
  - Question on longevity of program and concerns of funds running out before people can do the work? Maggie understands this program is a permeant fund and bondable - so hoping that this program will continue, she will find out more info on long term plan and let us know.

- Denver Days 2022 Announced free permits for block parties
  - 7/30-8/6
  - 10 Year anniversary so lots of great things this year.
- Volume Based Pricing for Waste Currently this proposed program is going to committee (step before it goes to council) - looking like its going to be a close vote, so encourage your neighbors to show support, if you support this.
- DOTI Path to Jewell Iowa and Santa Fe Intersection Updates
  - No update Karen Good is currently covering our district in the interim with staffing changes, Maggie will try to get an update soon.

#### Denver Lumber Yard - 1580 S Santa Fe Dr - Daniel Frank, Developer

- Has Denver Lumber property under contract currently and is formally connecting
  to the community to learn about the neighborhood and communicate his process.
   He shared examples of other developments his company has done throughout
  metro Denver.
- Potentially rezone property to IMX-8 site currently zoned I-A, most likely would rezone to mixed use - with predominant residential use. No plans yet, just doing density studies at this time and connecting to the community. IMX-8 would allow up to eight story development - don't anticipate they would build eight due to marketablity. Connectivity, affordablity are things they want to incorporate. Taking this step to engage in the community and learn more.
- · Questions and Comments:
  - Jack concern of traffic as when the site to north was developed they
    had conflicts with existing intersection and locked in onsite. DF Part of
    the process will be to go through a consultant for traffic study and
    analysis to see what is feasible.
  - Mara affordablity and accessibility are things this community is really wanting in this neighborhood.
  - Rebecca why do you ask for eight when you don't anticipate eight? DF
     Next tier down in zoning is 5, and that is tight economically to make the project work. Zoning for 8 will allow some flexibility for density for the economics to work. The site will likely have some mitigation and this can be costly so the right balance of metrics makes the development work financially.
  - Comments were made about the need for grocery in this area.
  - Site could be an opportunity to develop employment opportunities or collaboration with both the BlueLine project on Acoma as well as the Urban Peak Shelter development to help those organizations thrive with this new development and serve in some employment or support.
  - Vertical farm was a innovative idea shared.
  - Concerns of parking in the area were discussed as there isn't street parking on Santa Fe.


# **Community announcements**

providing more parking than required with underground garage - 60+ cars now


